Dear Parents/Caregivers – Kia Orana, Greetings, Kia Ora, Talofa

This week is Cook Islands Language Week. It runs from Sunday 30 July to Saturday 5 August.

This year's theme for Te 'Epetoma o te reo Māori Kūki 'Āirani – Cook Islands Language Week is 'Ātuitui'ia au ki te au peu o tōku kāinga Ipukarea, which means, "connect me to the traditions & culture of my homeland".

This year's theme focuses on deepening Cook Islands people's connection to their traditions, cultures, and ultimately, their dialects of their many islands through their familial ties, cultural traditions of their *enua*, *vaka*, and the songs, dance, and *pe'e* (chants) of their family.

A huge thank you to all those whānau who attended the Learning Conversations last week. Teachers look forward to meeting with families to discuss your child's progress. It is not too late to make an appointment with your child's teacher. I will be asking teachers to contact any families that were unable to attend to arrange an alternative time.

Picking up and Dropping off Children: Thanks to all the parents and caregivers who are conscientious and careful when picking up or dropping off their children by car.

This is a reminder about the importance of safe and legal driver behaviour around our school gates – Main Rd and Homedale Rd.



The following driver behaviour puts all our children at risk:

- Parking on yellow lines
- Parking on blue lines (Homedale Road)
- Double parking
- Doing U turns on Main Rd
- Calling children across the road to your car

From time to time police officers and the Hutt City Council parking wardens will be patrolling around our school. Drivers who are parking illegally can be fined \$150.

Please remember everyone's safety before and after school!
