Dear Parents/Caregivers - Greetings, Kia Ora, Talofa



It's with sadness that we let you know that Wainuiomata High School Tumuaki/Principal, Janette Melrose (nee; Terry), passed away on Saturday 19 August.

Janette had been WHS Tumuaki for five years and has taught in Wainuiomata for almost 40 years. To honour Janette, Wainuiomata High School will be hosting a celebration of her life on Tuesday 22 August and Wednesday 23 August 2023.

To facilitate this Wainuiomata High School will be closed both days.

Our school will remain open but if you wish to take your child out of school to pay your respects, that will not be recorded as an absence, please note the following regarding timings:

Tuesday 22 August – Public Celebration

Janette and her whānau will be arriving at school at 10:00am and Janette will be moved into the Wharenui (Wainuiomata High School Meeting House).

- 11:00am Students of WHS welcomed in to pay respects (no powhiri)
- 12.00pm: Pōwhiri #1 for the community
- 1.30pm: Pōwhiri #2 for the community
- 2.30pm: Pōwhiri #3 for the community
- 3.30pm: Students of Wainuiomata welcomed in to pay respects (no powhiri)

Janette and her whanau will leave the Wharenui at 4.00pm.

Wednesday 23 August – Funeral Service

Janette and her whanau will arrive at school at 9:30am and Janette will be moved into the Auditorium. A brief service for her family, staff and friends will be held at 10:00am in the Auditorium, with refreshments following.

If attending any of the services you are requested to park on the street, but not on the median running down the centre of Parkway. If an area is coned off, please respect this and do not park there.

Janette has been a dedicated servant to education in Wainuiomata for nearly 40 years and has made inumerable impacts upon the lives of many. If you are one of those please make an effort to attend one of the services and let her whānau and friends see the high regard in which she was held and the difference she made.

Picking up and Dropping off Children: Thanks to all the parents and caregivers who are conscientious and careful when picking up or dropping off their children by car.
