# PARK PARK SAFELY NEAR SCHOOLS

Stopping on broken yellow lines, across a driveway, on a bus stop, and double parking are illegal and risky manoeuvres that endanger children and other pedestrians. If you choose to stop or park illegally you risk receiving a fine.

Stopped / parked on broken yellow lines	\$60
Double parked	\$60
Stopped / parked in front of or within 1 metre of a vehicle entrance or driveway	\$40
Stopped / parked on a bus stop	\$60
Stopped / parked on the footpath	\$40
Stopped / parked on or near a pedestrian crossing	\$60
Any stopping or parking that is inconsiderate to other road users, including pedestrians	\$60
Exceeding a P5 or P10 time limit (by up to 30mins)	\$12
Failing to stop and remain stopped for a school patrol sign. Fine and 20 demerit points	\$150

Please put children's safety first at all times. Enforcement by Police and parking wardens is designed to keep all road users safe.
