We ask that everyone takes care to ensure this gate is properly shut when they enter or leave the school grounds and if anyone sees Harrison out of the school grounds please encourage him back into the school grounds and / or let the office staff know he is out of the school grounds. 
Write some numbers on your board that you think you might throw with two dice.

Throw two dice and add them up.



If that total is on your game board you can cross one of those answers out.
